❖ To mitigate the threat of the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) to the Citizens of Meagher County, the following measures and services have been put into place:

- 3-17-2020 Meagher County declares a Local State of Emergency
- 3-20-2020 City Of White Sulphur Springs declares a Local State of Emergency
- 3-24-2020 Governor Bullock today issued a directive to extend closures of public schools and dine-in food service and alcoholic beverage businesses through April 10 and mandate social distancing measures to slow the spread of COVID-19 in Montana.

❖ With the exception of the Meagher County Library, all County operations remain open for business.

- If you feel ill and may have been exposed to the Coronavirus, please **DO NOT** COME directly to the hospital or clinic. First call one of the following numbers for screening.
 - Hospital/clinic 24/7: 406-547-3321
- Mental Health visits call 547-3888
- Mountainview Medical Center has a “NO Visiting” restriction in place for the entire facility

Reasons to come directly to the hospital include:

- Any emergencies **not** related to Coronavirus
- Uncontrolled fevers
- Shortness of breath
- Severe dehydration
- Other complicating diseases such as COPD, emphysema, or any other respiratory disorder

Please stay at home if you can. Plan your trips out of your home to limit contact. Try to grocery shop weekly. Use delivery or pickup services if they are available from our local stores and restaurants. Governor Bullock has asked that essential meetings/gatherings be kept to 10 people or less and only if there is a way to maintain 6 feet between all people. If you are given the choice to work from home, please try that option. This doesn't mean you always have to stay in your home, get out and soak up some sunshine when you can, just not in groups.

Please use good judgement when returning to our community from traveling. If you have traveled to an area where there is known Covid-19 please practice self-distancing, we recommend you also self-isolate if possible for 14 days, if you start to have symptoms please notify your primary care provider or Mountainview Medical Center at 406-547-3321.
